Change!

First of all, I hope everyone had a good Christmas, and I would like to wish you all a Happy and Blessed New Year.

Although I am writing this on Boxing Day Bank Holiday 2021, I am looking forward to 2022. The new year is a time to both evaluate the last year and anticipate the next year. I wonder what will be different in twelve month's time.

As St. Mary's Church goes into the new year, there are going to be many changes, some minor, some major. At the moment we do not know what they are going to be. But I wonder, what changes would you like to see at St. Mary's? I would love to know your hopes for the future. Maybe you could let me know when you see me, or maybe send me an e-mail.

I and the PCC are now preparing for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) which will be held before Easter. I know there seems lots of time, but Easter is not that far away. As my father used to say, "You can tell it is Christmas because there are Easter Eggs in the shops." I saw Hot Cross Buns in the shops before Christmas. Hot Cross Buns are of course traditionally eaten on Good Friday.

In preparation for the APCM, all the reports need to be written, gathered in and distributed in good time before the meeting.

At the APCM, the members of the church will read and hear the reports of the PCC. After the reports are read, we then elect a new PCC. Anyone who is on the Electoral Roll is able to stand to become a new member of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). If there is sufficient response, we will hold elections.

Legally the PCC is responsible for the financial affairs of the church parish and the maintenance of its assets, such as churches and church halls. The PCC also assists the clergy in the management of church affairs in the



This is a very important role in the life of the church. Nothing happens unless someone makes it happen. So if you feel that you would like to share in this, please talk to either Craig Hunter or Tony Pond, who are our Churchwardens.

If you are not on the Electoral Roll, please talk to Sue Arnold who will add your name.

On Sunday 26th December, "The Feast of Stephen", I preached about how in the early years following the crucifixion, the disciples of Jesus lost direction, and it appears that they forgot much of what Jesus taught them.

So they elected "outsiders" to do what Jesus taught them. Stephen was one of those "outsiders", and he was so successful they contrived to have him killed. He was stoned to death, and Saul, later known as Paul, was there. Stephen was the first Christian Martyr. I wonder if his death must have shocked Paul.

At St. Mary's, I hope that there are no "outsiders". Everyone who comes to church as part of the congregation is welcome and of course encouraged to take part in the running and development of the church.

It has been a really busy Christmas, in the two weeks either side of Christmas we must have welcomed about two hundred and fifty people to St. Mary's. We hope that everyone felt welcome, and part of the church.

As our church grows, there will inevitably be change. I hope and pray that you will become part of that change.

My dear Nephew Darren

Your annual accounts – all 146 pages, bound in their plastic covers and laid out in faultless detail – really are most impressive. I was rather envious to note you have a clergy 'discretionary fund'; if I were to be given such a thing, my cellar of claret would improve immeasurably – although that is perhaps the reason why I am not given one.

The size of your office expenses makes me wonder if you have a staff rivalling that of the European Community. I suppose that at least you are doing your bit for job creation. Our dear Miss Marigold, who spends two hours a week randomly filing pieces of paper, mistyping rotas and failing to re-order stationery, is only rewarded by being the first to find out who are booking marriages and having their babies baptised – and if they do not happen in that order, that will be another piece of information remembered for future use. All this is information beyond the price of jewels in village communities.

Our accounts have more by way of charm than they do of accuracy, generally consisting of one sheet of handwritten paper. A New Year's Resolution from Micah

Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of olive oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression...? He has shown you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the Lord require of you: To act justly and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God. (Micah 6:7-8)

I quite like olive oil; not the Popeye character but the cooking ingredient. Although I am not sure what I would do with even one river of oil, and I have nowhere to put a ram.

Still, this is one of my favourite Bible passages, and it is an ideal one for lawyers. It sums up in a very simple but helpful way what true religion should be. That makes it a good verse to start the year. The message is simple: God does not want empty promises or lip service, but our real devotion, from our heart.

What does it mean for us?

Do justly - Be honest and open in our dealings with others this year. Be dependable. We should say when things are going wrong and be appreciative when they go well. Be fair in our dealings, whether at home or at work or in church. Keep confidences and never pass on gossip.

Love mercy - Give people the benefit of doubt, do not take advantage of others and do not always criticise or complain. Accept apologies and explanations where we can, and be generous.

Walk humbly - Quietly get on with things. Do not make a big show of what we do.

Lastly, we are *required* to do these things. They are not options or choices but requirements. Like many requirements in the Bible, they are simple to understand, but not always simple to do. Happy New Year.

Heating the Church

Here is some chilling news about the church's heating and electricity bills: they could be doubling this year. The energy crisis is hitting the UK hard, and churches are not protected by the domestic energy cap.

That could leave many churches in the same plight as St George's in Rugby, which fears it will have to pay £10,000 for gas and electricity in 2022 – double what it paid last year.

Some churches have already turned off all their heating, apart from pew heaters for services.

We will have our contractor Masons working in the church from Monday 17th January to update our electrical system and lower the heaters, hopefully making things much warmer—as long as we can afford to turn it on!

Call for action to free Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe

The Bishop of Chelmsford, Dr Guli Francis-Dehqani, is calling upon the British Government to repay its £400-million debt to Iran, and take immediate action to secure the release of Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe.

Mrs Zaghari-Ratcliffe was first jailed in Iran five years ago, accused of crimes that involved plotting against the Iranian government. Last year she lost her appeal against a second prison sentence and was then ordered to return to prison for another year, with a further year of a travel ban. Late last year her husband engaged in a 21-day hunger strike outside the Foreign Office, to try and persuade the British Government to take action.

Britain owes Iran £400 million over the purchase of Challenger tanks. It is an acknowledged historical debt. It is widely assumed that the debt is linked to the continued imprisonment of Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe.
