# **Itchy Ears**

For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, <sup>4</sup>and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. <sup>5</sup>As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully. (2 Timothy 4:3)

This was part of the New Testament reading this morning (21<sup>st</sup> February 2022) at Morning Prayer. The image of "itchy ears" struck a chord with me. I wondered, "What is it we are dissatisfied with in our lives?"

I wonder, "Why do we not appreciate the simple gift of life itself".

Having recently been seriously ill twice in the last two years, I think some of my values might be changing. Like the writers of the Book of Common Prayer in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century, each new day has value. In the Collect for Grace we read:


O LORD, our heavenly Father, Almighty and everlasting God, who hast safely brought us to the beginning of this day: Defend us in the same with thy mighty power; and grant that this day we fall into no sin, neither run into any kind of danger; but that all our doings may be ordered by thy governance, to do always that is righteous in thy sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

There is a similar prayer in the modern version, but less eloquent.

In a world where truth appears complicated, we might ask ourselves, "What is truth?" In John 13:28 as part of the exchange between Pontius Pilate and Jesus, we read that Pilate asks Jesus, "What is truth?"

I think the answer might well be contained in "The Great Commandment". I say it every time I preside at Eucharist. In answer to the question, "Which commandment is the first of all?" we read Jesus' reply.

"The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."



When we read the papers, watch TV or even Facebook, this commandment of "loving neighbour" should be the gate through which truth should be able to be seen. But how do we handle a situation where there is a deliberate effort to confuse what might be truth?

Although the situation may well have changed when you read this, at the time of writing, the situation in the Ukraine is still cloaked in deliberate confusion. Where does love our neighbour fit in with that situation? In 2020 one writer in the Guardian wrote, "Putin's goal is to confuse the public and to spread the idea that the truth is unknowable."

When one asks "What about other leaders?" one can see where confusion lies and used for malicious purposes. Do our leaders in the west lie to their own advantage as well?

How do we respond? What can we do?

I think it is helpful to look at the consequences of decisions or plans. We need to ask ourselves if people will be at a disadvantage because of a decision.

We are warned about judging each other in the Bible, but we are not judging other people, we are looking at the consequences of actions.

As we begin to prepare for Lent, from Ash Wednesday through until Good Friday and the Resurrection at Easter, I plan to look at the consequences of what Jesus said and did. This will lead us to Pontius Pilate's question, "What is truth?"

Are we consistent, do we follow a clear path towards truth, or do we have Itchy Ears and wander away to myths"?

Can we help to "make Thy kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven?"

# Ash Wednesday, 2nd March

# No service this year at St Mary's due to COVID


Such a strange name for a church service! Why would anyone be attracted to attend such a thing?

This year Ash Wednesday is close to the start of March; on the Second of the month. As the first day of Lent the service is used to physically place a sign of the cross on each person's forehead using ashes made from the previous year's palm crosses. The use of ashes has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship; the Old Testament referring to sackcloth and ashes over twenty times.

There is clearly a visual link with the blackness of evil and sin but also the 'dirtiness' that spreads everywhere from it. We all know how a small amount of mud on the shoes walked into the house will soon go everywhere and take a much harder and longer clean-up operation than if it was wiped off before entering. In Christian records, ashes are used for penitents by the sixth century, but it is not until the beginning of the eleventh century that the faithful took part in a ceremony on the Wednesday before Lent that included the imposition of ashes. Still later this came to be called Ash Wednesday.

The Imposition of Ashes is a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. It is 'felt' in the heart and soul – as well as on the skin. And can be one of the most profound experiences of humility as we enter together as a Christian community across the globe our journey towards the Cross and the Resurrection.

As the priest says the traditional words over you, "Remember that you are but dust, and to dust you will return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ. Amen." what will you be focusing upon?





On Thursday(24th Feb 2022), both Archbishops Welby & Cottrell issued a pastoral letter to the clergy and people of the Church of England, calling on them to pray for peace in Ukraine.

They wrote: "This attack is an act of evil, imperilling as it does the relative peace and security that Europe has enjoyed for so long.

"The attack by one nation on a free, democratic country has rightly provoked outrage, sanctions, and condemnation.

"We lament with the people of Ukraine, and we pray for the innocent, the frightened and those who have lost loved ones, homes, and family.

"We continue to call for a ceasefire and the withdrawal of Russian forces as well as wide-ranging efforts to ensure peace, stability and security."

In a video he recorded in Brussels, Bishop Robert spoke of the Church of England congregation of Christ Church, Kyiv, Ukraine.

"Our little church in Kyiv are right at the centre of this crisis," he explained.


"Some of them have fled the city by car, others are still there.

"These are our people, our brothers and sisters, and of course we are very concerned for their wellbeing and safety.

"In the face of military action and aggression, we feel powerless. What can we do?


## **Situations Vacant**

## Hedgehog New Homes Required



The South Essex Wildlife Hospital is a rescue, rehabilitation and public advice charity formed by Sue Schwar in 1995. Sue started the charity as there was no wildlife care or rescue centres anywhere in the area. Initially helping animals in her own home, Sue was soon overwhelmed by the sheer volume of sick animals needing her care so a more suitable location was found.

The Hospital can get between 50 and 100 phone calls a day and often has between 200-300 patients. They are currently in great need of suitable hedgehog release sites. If you would like to re-home a hedgehog you will need to meet the criteria as hogs are only being released to areas of proven habitat.
